Whether it's helping hawks or hummingbirds, waterbirds or songbirds, there's plenty to do at The Bird Rescue Center of Sonoma County, especially during baby bird season.

For over 30 years, through the efforts of trained volunteers and supporting veterinarians, a large percentage of the 3000 sick or injured wild birds that come to the Center every year are rehabilitated and released back into the wild. Vital to this success are the many dedicated people who have completed the 16-hour volunteer training and have committed to a minimum number of shifts at the hospital.

If you are at least 12 years old and interested in the many unique volunteer opportunities at The Bird Rescue Center, you should attend an orientation. You will be introduced to The Bird Rescue Center's history and programs, requirements for volunteer participation, and tour the facility during the two-hour orientation session. **We have volunteers ranging in age from 12 to 80+ and everything in between so come join us!**
