A Warbling Vireo (*Vireo gilvus*) came to us last week after being found on the ground by a Good Samaritan in Rohnert Park. It kept its feet balled up for a day and after some pain medicine and time to relax, was able to perch and fly perfectly after just a few days. Now that it's become even more active to the point of being aggressive, it's time to return home. According to Cornell Lab of Ornithology, Warbling Vireos spend most of their time in the treetops of deciduous woods and when it comes to nesting they 'weave a rounded hanging cup, usually suspending the nest from a horizontally forked twig'. Mostly they are known and identified by their intricate song: SOUND CLIP. Currently you may see or hear these mid-size songbirds as they make their way to Mexico and Central America for the winter months.
