Thermal Release



An Adult Barn Owl (*Tyto alba*) came to The Bird Rescue Center on January 3rd after being possibly struck by a vehicle. It was found to have a broken ulna near the wrist joint with bruising on the spinal column and around the hips. She couldn't feed herself at first so we did that for her for a week, but then suddenly she was up and about. It took another two weeks for the complicated fracture to heal properly and for us to perform physical therapy to insure her wings were equally able to support her in

flight. As soon as she was moved into an aviary she was feisty, flying, and hunting as if nothing had ever happened. Since owls in general are difficult to photograph at release photos or videos-- our ingenious Shift Supervisor, Katie Miller, was able to get a thermal video of the release back to the area where it was found in Salmon Creek on February 7th!
